
Support \$700 million for USDA Agriculture & Food Research Initiative


However, meeting the challenges facing our world requires an even greater commitment to food and agriculture research.

The Agriculture and Food Research Initiative (AFRI) is the premier agricultural competitive grants program for basic and applied research on food, agriculture, natural resources, clean energy production, rural development and nutrition.

To spur innovation, we ask Congress to support AFRI at \$700 million in FY2017.



Thriving Workforce



AFRI plays a critical role in training the next generation of food and agriculture researchers.

Each year, AFRI supports almost 2,000 undergraduate, graduate and postdoctoral students for careers in the food, agricultural and natural resource sciences.

Employment opportunities in advanced agriculture fields are projected to grow 5% by 2019, adding over 33,000 new positions.
